Where is the event taking place?

Glasgow Women's Library, 23 Landressy St, Bridgeton, Glasgow G40 1BP

What are the timings of the event?

There are three events starting at different times on different days. Please make sure the time and date on your booking corresponds with the correct Event Start time.

Audiences should take their seats no later than 10 minutes before the event starts.

Please be aware, this is a discussion workshop only, **it will not include a film screening**. The films discussed in these sessions will be screened elsewhere over Glasgow Film Festival. Please refer to our website to find screening dates for 'Carrie', 'Moulin Rouge!' and 'Born in Flames'.

Are there any age restrictions for this event?

While there's not an age restriction in place, this event will involve discussions of mature themes, and we would recommend it as best suited to aged 18 and over. * Content warning: To fully

understand the picture it is important to explore readings with oppositional points of view, views explored in the session do not necessarily reflect Glasgow Film and Hannah Granberry.

When will I be required to vacate the venue?

There is no post-workshop activity, audiences are kindly asked to vacate the event space after the workshop ends.

What activities can ticket holders take part in?

Ticket holders will take part in a discussion workshop led by facilitator Dr. Hannah Granberry. The sessions will draw from the films *Carrie*, *Moulin Rouge!* and *Born in Flames*.

Will there be food at the event?

No, food will not be available at the venue for this event.

Will there be alcohol for sale at the event?

There will be no alcohol for sale at these events. You are not permitted to bring your own alcohol to the event.

Where can I find information about access to the venue?

The Library is wheelchair accessible, with lifts to the first floor. There are power-assisted doors into the Main Library space, from the Main Library to the lift, and from the lift and Gallery to the Community Room. Please note that Bridgeton train station is currently not wheelchair-accessible. The closest wheelchair-accessible station is Dalmarnock Station, which is approximately 3/4 mile (1.2 km) from the Library. There is level access from nearby bus stops on London Road and Bridgeton Cross to the Library.

Glasgow Women's Library has accessible toilets on the ground and first floors, and all the bathrooms are individual closed stalls and are gender neutral. Can I reserve a space for my wheelchair and/or carer?

Access requests, including for wheelchairs and carers, should be booked in advance through GFT – please call on (0141) 332 6535 (option 2) and leave a voicemail if we are unable to take your call. Please e-mail access@glasgowfilm.org if you have any accessibility requirements.

There is 1 wheelchair space and 1 carer seat available for each workshop

How do I enter the venue?

The venue can be accessed via the main entrance at 23 Landressy Street. This is step-free access.

How do I get to the venue?

By train: The closest railway station to the Library is Bridgeton station – take the low-level train from Glasgow Central. Please note that Bridgeton Station is not wheelchair-accessible, and the platforms are accessed by a long flight of stairs. The closest wheelchair-accessible station is Dalmarnock Station, which is approximately 3/4 mile (1.2 km) from the Library.

By bus: Take the 18, 43, 46, 64, 65, 164, 263 or 2 to London Road/Bridgeton Cross

By bike: Cycling Route 75 follows the Clyde to Glasgow Green which is a 3 minute ride from Landressy Street along cycle paths. There are bike racks in the small square on James Street as well as Glasgow Women's Library's very own bike shelter which is available for visitors. It is locked but please ask the front of house team if you would like to use it.

By car: There is a space on the street outside the Library that is reserved for visitors with mobility issues, but there is no carpark at the Library.

Where can I collect my tickets from?

Please bring either your physical ticket or digital booking confirmation to the venue.

Physical tickets can be collected from any of our festival box offices up to two hours before doors open.

Opening times for the festival box offices may vary, please check our website closer to the time for the most up-to-date information.

Will you be selling tickets at the door?

If our event does not sell out, then tickets will be available to buy on the door. However, this event has limited capacity and might sell out. We advise you to book your tickets as soon as possible.

What is your refund policy?
